

Primary school PE and sport funding

In 2012, the government made the decision to provide funding directly to primary schools in order to improve the provision that your child receives in physical education (PE) and school sport.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport; working within a set of guidelines they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

This is how you can expect to see the funding being used at Manor Fields School:

- A school environment which encourages children to be physically active and make healthy lifestyle choices.
- All students from year 1 – 6 will be taught by a specialist PE teacher for at least 1 hour a week
- Supporting the provision of a range of physically active lunch and after school clubs for children of all ages
- Supporting the financial cost of extra-curricular sports clubs, particularly for pupil premium children
- Training for the class teachers for their professional development in PE and sport
- A wider range of inter school competitions running which increases pupils' participation in the School Games competitions
- Every child in years 1 – 6 being involved in at least four inter house competitions throughout the school year
- Early years children will receive a variety of fun physical activity sessions led by the specialist PE teacher throughout the year and training support for staff.
